Committee	What has not changed?	What has changed?
Senate Finance	Finance member Steve Daines (R-MT) won a tight reelection campaign against Steve Bullock, the state’s Democratic governor. Other committee members up for reelection that also held their seats include Republicans John Cornyn (TX), Ben Sasse (NE), Bill Cassidy (LA) and Democrat Mark Warner (VA).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kansas Sen. Pat Roberts (KS) retired this year and will be replaced in the Senate by Republican Roger Marshall, who currently represents Kansas in the House of Representatives. • Sen. Mike Enzi (R-WY) is also retiring and will be replaced in the Senate by Republican Cynthia Lummis, representing Wyoming in the House from 2007-2017. • With Sen. Chuck Grassley’s (R-IA) chairmanship coming to an end, Sen. Mike Crapo (R-IA) is expected to take the Finance chair if the Senate remains under Republican control, and Sen. Ron Wyden (D-OR), the current ranking member, is expected to lead the committee if Democrats take the Senate.
Senate HELP	Committee members who retained their seats after Tuesday’s election include— Sens. Bill Cassidy (R-LA), Tina Smith (D-MN) and Susan Collins (R-ME).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Democratic member Sen. Doug Jones (AL) lost his Senate seat to Republican Tommy Tuberville. • It is still unclear whether Republican committee member Sen. Kelly Loeffler (GA) will keep her Senate seat.
Senate Aging	Senator Susan Collins (R-ME) will remain on the Special Committee on Aging	
House Ways and Means	The House Ways & Means Committee will remain unchanged after most representatives on the committee kept their seats post-election. This includes Chair Richard Neal (D-MA) and Ranking Republican Kevin Brady (TX).

Eliot Engel (NY), Joseph Kennedy (MA) and Ben Ray Lujan (NM).
